The committee-approved dissertation must be submitted in an application for a dissertation defence. Student must regularly consult with a supervisor during the entire period of postgraduate study (150 hours). Without a supervisor's approval, postgraduate students cannot submit their dissertation. The dissertation has also to include text of their postgraduate paper, which they submit to the dissertation defence. The dissertation must meet all formal and content criteria corresponding to this type of thesis. The dissertation defence has to be executed, at the very latest, on the last day of standard postgraduate study determined by the study programme, or in extra postgraduate study, which can be no longer than two years after the standard postgraduate study.

The commission for the state exam decides the passing of this subject, which takes into consideration the dissertation assessments by a reader and supervisor, as well as a dissertation defence. The dissertation defence is assessed by each member of the committee. They take into consideration the content of the dissertation thesis, satisfaction of answers on questions in its assessments, and the ability of the student to apply knowledge acquired in the study programme in its defence. Final assessment is the average of each member's grade.
