### Brief outline of the course:

Linguistic directions and currents at the turn of the 20th century and their legacy for linguistic research

– neogrammarians, neolinguistics, structuralism and Ferdinand de Saussure, Prague school and functional linguistics, variants of structuralism, generative grammar, quantitative and experimental schools in linguistics, sociolinguistics, cognitive linguistics, and ethnolinguistics. The concepts in literary studies from the end of the 19th century until present and their application in the artistic literary research. From the positivist methods in literary studies, historical poetics, formalist and structuralist approaches towards innovative methodologies and productive multidisciplinarity.
