Brief outline of the course:

Language as a sign system. Semiotics. Linguistic sign. The system of linguistic knowledge about the Slovak vs. other languages, structural and functional description. Language classification. Explanatory linguistics. Principles – the instruments of scholarly thinking and language functioning. Linguistic pragmatics. Language dynamics. Context as supporting point of pragmatics. Theory of intention and conversational implicatures. Speech act theory. The cognitive theory of pragmatics. Discourse analysis. The spectrum and variety of discourse analysis. The relationship between discourse and world. Social constructivism. Persuasion. Discussion, polemic, and searching the truth. Sociolinguistics. Stratification sociolinguistics – language variability,

standard language, language policy, language culture. Interactional sociolinguistics – language communication communication as a process of accommodation and assimilation. The principles of language communication – cooperation vs. rivalry.
