## Learning objectives:

On the basis of the acquired knowledge, the student expands and develops his/her knowledge of the legal regulation of commercial obligations, including the subsidiary application of civil law norms. On the basis of theoretical knowledge, the student is able to interpret the legal norms of the law of commercial obligations, to apply these norms to solve specific problems in commercial obligation relations, to critically analyse the current legislation, to reflect on the upcoming legislative changes and to formulate his/her own opinions and proposals de lege ferenda. The teaching focuses to a greater extent on the legal regulation of individual contractual types and institutes regulated in the Commercial Code, including obligations arising from international trade.

## Brief outline of the course:

Introduction to the issue of commercial obligations. Formation, security and termination of commercial obligations. Commercial liability. Contract of sale. Contract for work. Procurement contracts. Transport contracts. Licensing agreement. Banking contracts. International trade obligations.

# Learning objectives:

The aim of the course is to familiarize doctoral students with current issues of civil law and, from a broader perspective, private law. After completing the course, the student will gain an overview of the legislative changes adopted and their impact on civil law. The content of the course will also include an analysis of the forthcoming changes within the framework of the recodification of private law in the Slovak Republic and related considerations de lege ferenda.

## Brief outline of the course:

Students are introduced to current topical issues in civil law to the extent of:

- 1. Legislative changes adopted in the field of civil law,
- 2. Analysis of the impact and influence of legislative changes on civil law in the Slovak Republic,

3. Impact of EU law on private law in the Slovak Republic,

4. Legislative initiatives and forthcoming changes in the field of civil (private) law.

Within the individual teaching points of the course, students will be guided to formulate reflections and proposals de lege ferenda.
